Exhibit 3. Incidence and Mortality of Top 10 Common Cancers, All Races Combined, Males, Los Angeles County, 2003-2007

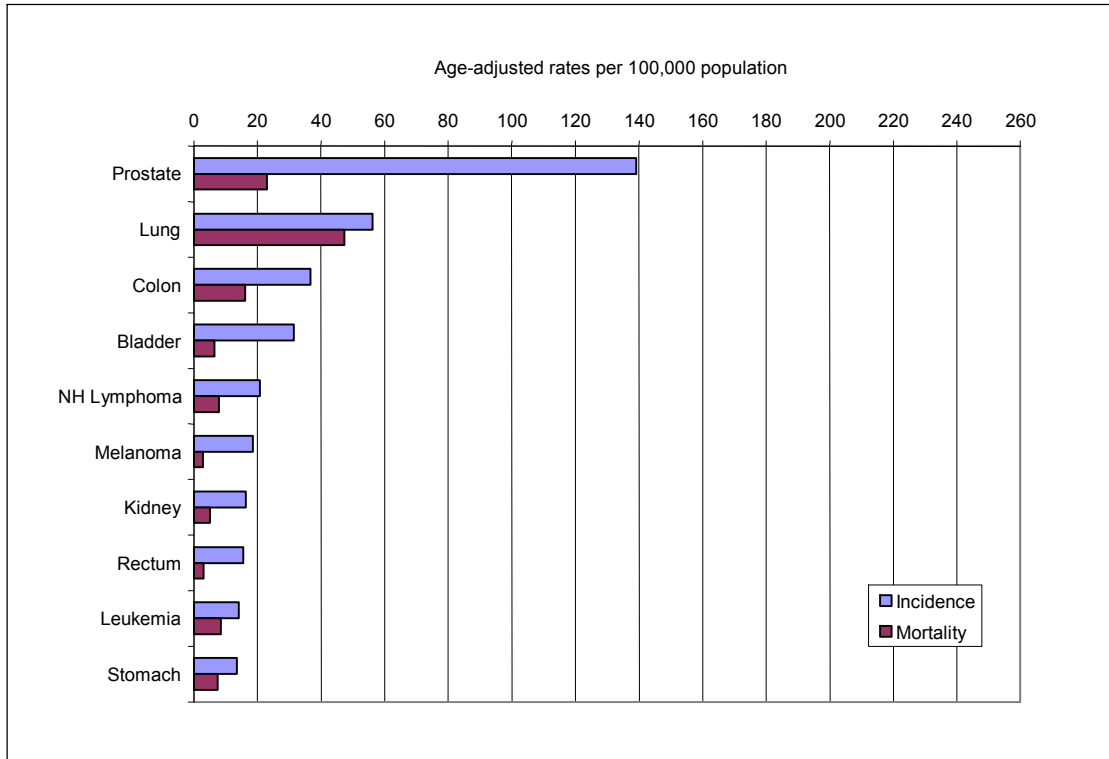


Exhibit 4. Incidence and Mortality of Top 10 Common Cancers, All Races Combined, Females, Los Angeles County, 2003-2007.

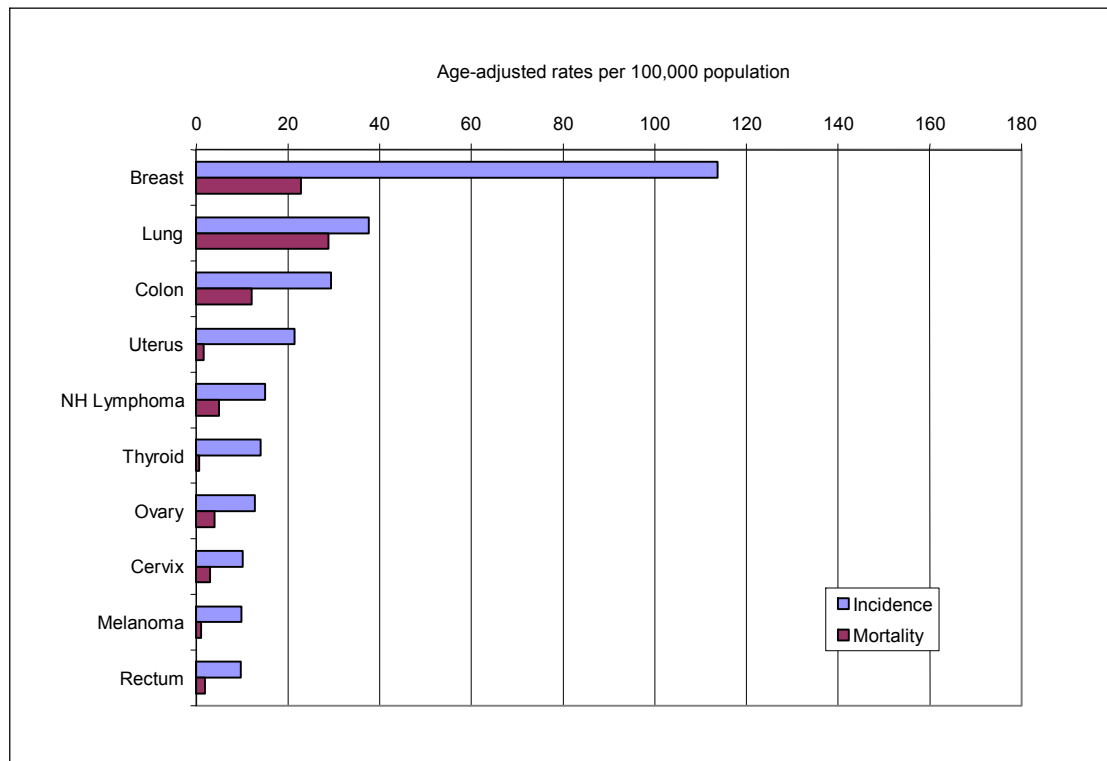
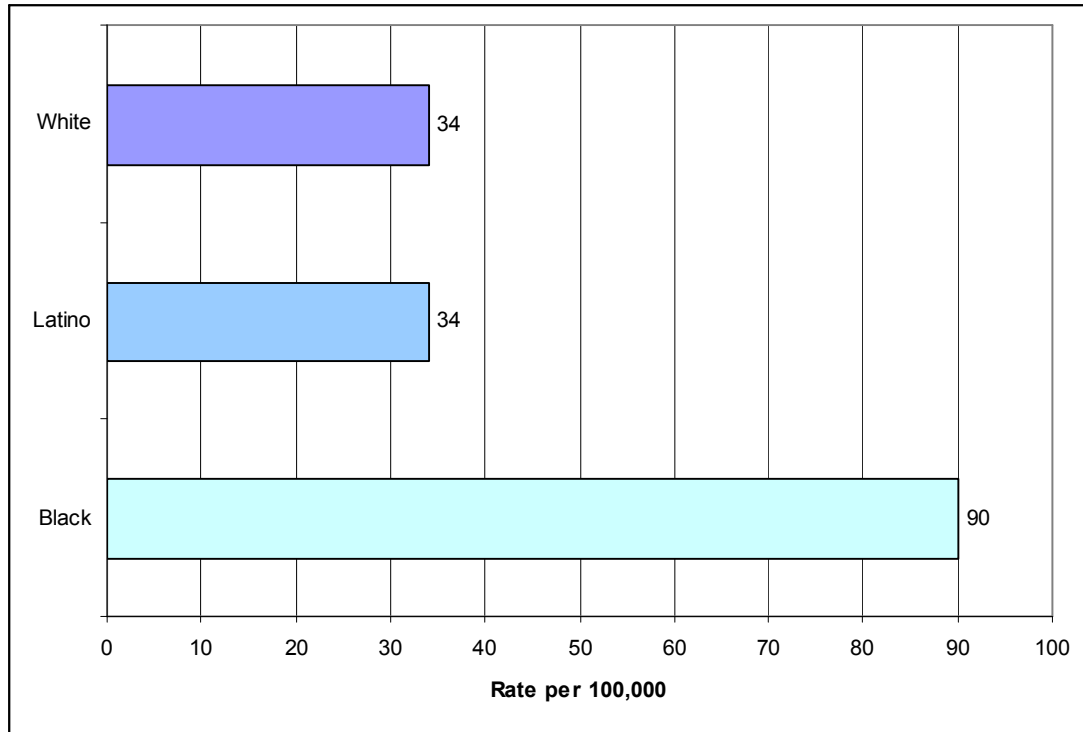


Exhibit 5. Estimated rate of new HIV infections by race/ethnicity.

Exhibit 7. Percent Uninsured by Race and Ethnicity in Los Angeles, 2007.

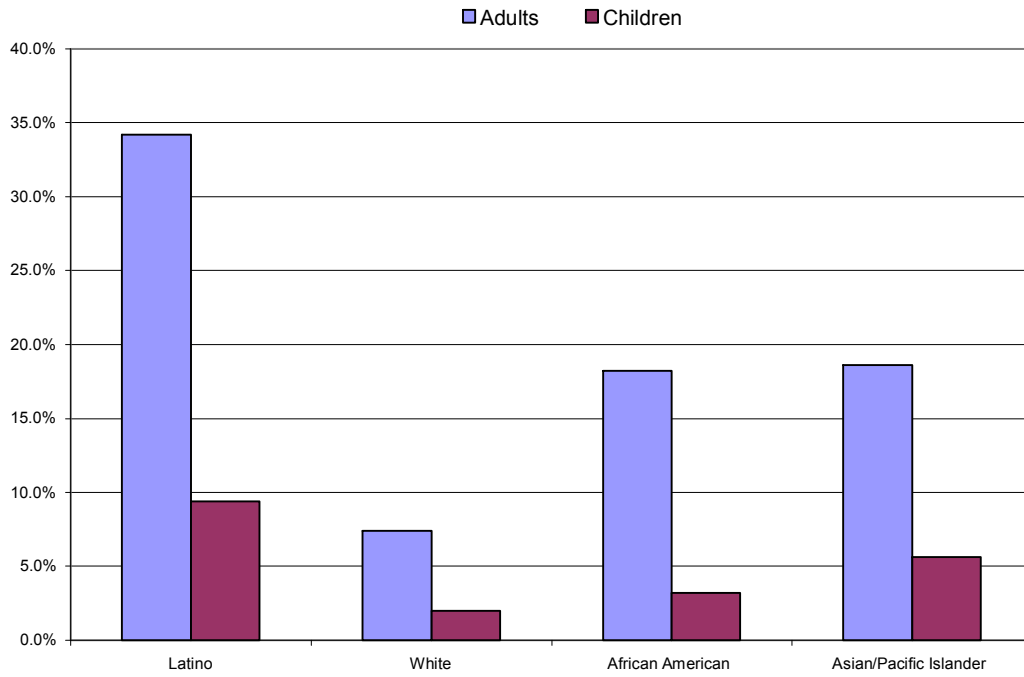


Exhibit 8. Distribution of Uninsured Adults by Race and Ethnicity in Los Angeles County, 2007.

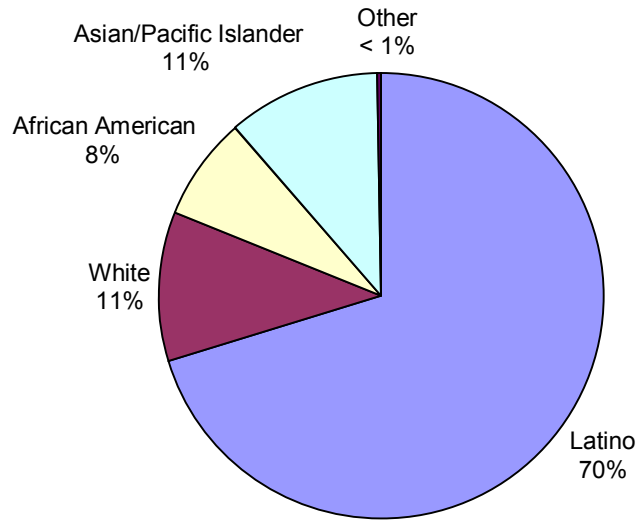
